Volleyball \$110 per child

Age levels: 9-11, 11-14

Description: This skills camp will help children develop and build basic volleyball skills. The younger group will focus on learning the basics of volleyball: rules, passing, setting, and hitting. The older group will work on the basics, but also focus on serving and receiving, digs, hitting, and court awareness.

> Flag Football \$110 per child

Age Levels: 5-9, 9-11, 11-14

Description: Kids will get to learn more about the game of football without having to leave the gym for the hot sun! Every day campers will learn a new position: quarterback, receiver, and running back. Kids will have opportunities to scrimmage to put their skills into practice.

> All-Sports \$110 per child

Age Levels: 5-9, 9-11, 11-14

Description: Just imagine being in P.E. for three hours of fun! There will be Kickball, Ultimate Frisbee, Knockout, Dodgeball...so many games, you just need to come see it for yourself.

Basketball \$110 per child

Age Levels: 5-9, 9-11, 11-14

Description: This skills camp will focus on building ball handling and team-work skills. For the younger ages, coaches will focus on dribbling, passing, and shooting. The older kids will work on the basics but also focus on offense and defense, leadership, and team play. Every camp day will end with the chance to scrimmage.

Soccer \$110 per child

Age Level: 5-9

Description: This beginner soccer camp is geared toward children who do not have much soccer experience. Kids will get to learn basic soccer skills like dribbling, passing, and shooting, with scrimmages to put their skills into practice. All of this will take place in the gym rather than out in the hot sun!

> Dodgeball \$110 per child

Age Levels: 5-9, 9-11, 11-14

Description: Who knew there were 8 different versions of Dodgeball? Your kids will have a blast learning and playing all of them.

July 8 – 11

Musical Theater 101 \$175 per student

Grades 4 – 7

Description: Come get a taste of musical theater! We will learn about all aspects of a musical theater production: acting, music, and movement. Students will learn to develop a character and project their voices in speaking and singing. On Thursday evening, they will perform a scene for family and friends to showcase what they have learned!





PCS Pond Ecology \$150 per student Grades 7 – 12 Teacher: Madison Smith Time: 9:00 – 11:00 AM

Description: Come "ponder" God's creation this summer and discover nature on campus! We will observe and study the many different organisms living in our PCS pond—from microorganisms to fish to fowl—and their interactions with each other and with the pond environment. This investigation will blend biology, physics, and chemistry concepts as we study our corner of God's creation.

Acting 101 \$175 per student

Grades 7 – 12

Time: 12:30 – 3:30 PM

Description: Take a deep dive into the art of acting! Using Stanislavski's systematic approach, students will learn the art of character development and of finding their emotional truth. They will use their voices to project and enunciate clearly, important skills as they prepare for and enter the Rhetoric stage. On Thursday evening, students will perform a piece for family and friends to showcase what they have learned.

Printmaking with a Purpose \$175 per student


Grades 1 – 6

Grades 5 – 8 Teacher: Brenda Vorhies Time: 1:00 – 2:30 PM




Eye on Engineering \$125 per student

Grades 9 – 12


Teachers: Engineering professionals in the PCS community


