





EXCELLENCE OUTSIDE OF THE CLASSROOM

TAPPS SOLO & ENSEMBLE COMPETITION

Our strings, recorder, and handbell musicians competed at the TAPPS Solo & Ensemble competition. All our strings players earned a Superior "I" rating on their individual solos, and in addition, our Recorder Ensemble and Handbell Choir received a Superior "I" rating on their performances.

MOCK TRIAL

The Mock Trial team won the Houston Regionals and went on to place 10th in State amongst all schools, public and private. In addition, at the state level, freshman Brinley Stratton and junior Luke Williamson both qualified for Best Witness, and Luke Williamson also qualified for Best Advocate. Senior Rachel Henry competed separately at State in the courtroom artist competition after winning the courtroom artist category at Regionals.

EPHESIANS RECITATION CHALLENGE

Each year, Mrs. Martin challenges 6th graders to cap off their time in Grammar School by reciting the entire book of Ephesians. For only the second time in PCS history, two students completed this daunting challenge (and they happen to be siblings)! Congratulations to Selah Birch and Gabriel Birch for setting an incredible example of how to hide God's Word in our hearts.

CONGRESSIONAL BRIEFING

Sophomore Turner Young traveled to Washington, D.C. to speak at a congressional briefing for the Coalition of Skin Diseases titled "Skin Disease: How Science, PBMs, and Access to Care are Impacting 84 Million Americans." Turner is a teen patient advocate. His goal is to lobby Congress to adjust regulations so that minors may have improved access to more effective drugs for the treatment of psoriasis.

NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLAR

Senior Henry Stevens was recognized as a Scholar in the National Merit Scholarship Program. Approximately 1.5 million high school juniors take the PSAT/NMSQT to enter this competition and earn recognition and scholarships, fewer than 1% are commended, and less than half of that 1% are recognized as a Scholar.

TEXAS BOYS & GIRLS STATE

American Legion Boys and Girls State is a summer leadership and citizenship program for high school juniors which focuses on exploring American government and politics. PCS 11th graders Sam Bachelder, Price Jenkins, Ellie Lancaster, Wesley Sotiropoulos, and Luke Williamson were chosen to attend.




GRAMMAR SCHOOL: A GREAT PLACE TO BEGIN

Students entering school for the first time are full of excitement but also apprehension as they embark on the new adventure of school. They are unsure of what to expect, or, for many of them, how to appropriately interact with other children their age. They need a consistent, loving, and structured environment with a clear leader and a predictable schedule. Providence provides each of these things! Not only is all our curriculum taught through a Biblical worldview, but teachers model Christlike behavior and nurture Christlike responses and forgiveness when squabbles arise in the classroom or on the playground.

LOGIC SCHOOL: A GREAT PLACE TO BELONG

PCS is a place where Logic School students are seen for who they are and are loved well. Logic School teachers are uniquely positioned to move students along the road from childhood to adulthood not just academically, but also spiritually. Students at this age are making their faith their own, and courses like Bible Survey and Truth & Logic help shape the theology of these adolescents. Teachers and administration model the love and priorities of Christ to Logic School students.
