- As you know, information and predictions regarding the coronavirus over the next 12 months are continually shifting. We fully anticipate starting **on campus** next

school year and are already working on plans to deliver our mission with excellence and safety. Our campus provides unique advantages to be able to accommodate social distancing if that is still necessary in the fall. This means that we will have more flexibility than Klein and other local ISDs to conduct classes on campus. Current predictions indicate that the fall will have the fewest potential disruptions due to the virus, and we need to take advantage of this. It is for this reason that we will be beginning the 2020-21 school year on **Monday, August 24**. This will now be the first day of school. We do not anticipate other significant changes to the Academic Calendar but will provide a revised version by May 22.
