Complete one registration form per student. After completing this form, your PCS incidental account will be updated with camp charges by the 15th or the end of the month. Families who do not attend PCS will be billed separately. Full payments complete the registration process and reserve your student's spot on the camp roster. Sessions are transferable, but nonrefundable.

Camps must reach a minimum count of 6 students and have a max capacity of 16 students. If camps do not meet the minimum requirement by May 30, 2025 PCS reserves the right to cancel the session and will offer to transfer payment to another session or issue a full refund.




Knights & Princesses (Pre-K & Kinder) - Supply Fee \$5


